eSchoolCare: Providing Practice Supports to WV School Nurses

The purpose of this presentation is to describe eSchoolCare, a web-based mobile resource that provides school nurses with expert-reviewed, evidence-based, up-to-date resources on student chronic health conditions. This electronic school health resource site is **FREE** to WV School Nurses through a partnership with WVDE and WVDHHR to purchase access rights for frontline school health professionals to have evidence-based research at your fingertips. Content is focused on supporting school-based care of students with chronic conditions such as allergies, asthma, cancer, diabetes, epilepsy, and mental health disorders. The program focuses on contemporary school nursing challenges presented in caring for increasingly numerous and complex children with chronic conditions.

She has conducted studies of families with CSHCN and has completed a national survey of school nurses to document their experience in caring for CSHCN. A certified pediatric nurse practitioner and a nationally certified school nurse, Dr. Anderson has practiced in both school and public health settings.
