Cystic Fibrosis: Nuts and Bolts

Managing a child with Cystic Fibrosis (CF) can be challenging for health care providers and parents. This webinar will explore the epidemiology of CF while reviewing the frequent complications and key infection control issues. It will provide key steps to care such as airway clearance modalities, gastrointestinal therapies and nutrition. Some common issues experienced by children diagnosed with CF while attending school will be discussed in this webinar along with future therapies.
