Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome Early and Long Term Effects on the Child – An update of current prevalence of Substance Exposure and Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome in West Virginia, trends and what is known of long term effects.

Presenter: Molly McMillion, RN, BSN is an International Board Certified Lactation Consultant, Lamaze Certified Childbirth Educator, and Child Passenger Safety Technician. A nurse for 28 years, Molly has served the Greenbrier Valley for 17 years doing lactation consultation and teaching Lamaze Childbirth Classes. She started "Drug Free Mother Baby Greenbrier Valley" a program which has greatly reduced the number of babies exposed to drugs born at Greenbrier Valley Medical Center. For the past 4 years, she has been a Special Projects Consultant for the West Virginia Perinatal Partnership and is now the Director of The WV Breastfeeding Alliance, the state's breastfeeding coalition.
