Bio:

Dr. David B. Watson is the Interim Chairman of the West Virginia University Department of Neurology and Director of the WVU Headache Center. He has been in the full-time practice of Headache Medicine for nearly thirteen years, initially with the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center and now with West Virginia University School of Medicine. He is board certified in Neurology by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology and is certified in Headache Medicine by the United Council of Neurologic Subspecialties.

Dr. Watson has articles published in national and regional journals, a book chapter, and has presented at national scientific meetings for the American Academy of Neurology and the Southern Headache Society on topics related to headache disorders and patient advocacy. He has also presented to national patient meetings including the American Headache and Migraine Association and Clusterbusters.

Dr. Watson is active in the American Academy of Neurology, serving on its Government Relations Committee, Gender Disparities Subcommittee, Advocacy Leadership Subcommittee, and chairing the Grassroots Working Group. He has been an advocate, advisor, and faculty for the AAN's Palatucci Advocacy Leadership Forum, where he served as Moderator in 2015. At WVU he has been a member of many committees through the School of Medicine.

In addition, Dr. Watson established and chairs Runnin' For Research, Inc., a non-profit organization dedicated to raising money for headache and migraine research, promoting disease awareness, and supporting patient advocacy. To date, R4R has donated nearly \$70,000 to support its mission.
