ADVERSE CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES (ACEs)

All parents care about their children and want to do everything they can to maximize their child's potential to be a successful adult. However, many families and students are faced with challenges that have the potential to disrupt and derail our children's future. Adverse Childhood Experiences or ACEs is being talked about a lot. Our schools, health care centers, and community groups are learning what are ACEs and what the potential effects of these negative childhood experiences are, if left unattended. Research shows that ACEs and trauma can have a profound impact in impeding our children's health, learning and overall quality of life.

Join us for a one-hour webinar to learn about what effect trauma can possibly have on a child's life. Not only will the impact be described, but more importantly, what can we do as schools, and parents when they work together to mitigate the negative effects of ACEs by building resiliency in our children through identifying protective factors. Participants will also learn what parents can do at home to support the development of a child who has experienced trauma in their life.
