Junior Master Gardner Fact Sheet

The Junior Master Gardener program is an international science and horticulture based youth gardening program developed by Texas Cooperative Extension Office out of Texas A&M University designed to engage kids in individual hands on and group learning experiences which promote a love of gardening, and an appreciation for the environment.

What defines a JMG group?

- An adult Leader—no special requirements could be a teacher, scout leader or other volunteer
- 2. Establishment of a Site
- 3. Recruitment of a minimum of five youth
- 4. Usage of JMG materials particularly teacher/leaders guides
- 5. Complete Registration Packet

Curriculum

- A. There are four different curriculum guides that can be chosen based upon age and skill level. These guides cover:
 - 1. Instruction on developing your own JMG group (ex: choosing an adult leader, recruiting students and locating land)
 - 2. Science and Math based activities
 - 3. Basic gardening skills, growing techniques
 - 4. Community Interaction
 - 5. Conservation of natural Resources
 - 6. Conservation of Wildlife
 - 7. Life Skills
 - The appendices of each guide offers ideas on project funding, recruiting volunteers and collaboration
