Dr. Julie Watts McKee, Kentucky State Dental Director

Dr. McKee will share the struggles, issues and successes that Kentucky experience when addressing the state's long-standing oral health crisis. Kentucky closely resembles West Virginia in many ways. Dr. McKee will discuss the latest oral health programs and efforts and the funds which support them. Learn about the most recent oral health programs implemented by their governor and their state dental providers to improve the oral health status in Kentucky.

Brandon Lewis Environmental Resources Specialist-

Objectives-

Brandon holds a BS Degree in Chemistry from WV State College. He began his professional career with the WV State police, assigned to the Drug Identification Section, where he received extensive training in methamphetamine lab investigation and analysis. In 2044 he was assigned to the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner as a forensic Investigator/Toxicologist. In 2008 he became the Program Coordinator of the newly formed Clandestine Drug Laboratory Remediation Program. Brandon will speak to the risks, dangers as a result of the meth use in our schools and communities. Recent events including WV public school closing due to meth residue brings home the fact that we could benefit by learning more about the signs and dangers of this drug. After completion of the course attendees will be able to:

- 1. Recognize the signs of Meth production contamination
- 2. Recognize and identify the hazards of Meth production
- 3. Learn the steps to take if you suspect meth use and/or production in your school, community or patients.

Dr. Jason Roush, Dental Director of West Virginia will discuss how the State dental plan address and supports the school-based community oral health efforts and the successes of the plan thus far. Additionally, he will give an update on the current status of the WV's DHHR Oral Health Program. This session will be a review of the WV State Oral Health plan and a discussion on the future of oral health within school and communities. The audience will leave with an understanding of the WV State Oral Health Plan, how it was developed, and the advancements already evident.

Around the State- Highlights from Various Models from within West Virginia

Nancy LaBrosse, RDH Ohio County Schools, will discuss two community programs.

- (1) "Seeing is Believing" a grant funded project designed as an after-school program.
- (2) Head Start and the Home Visitor program

Kelli Caseman, the Executive Director of the West Virginia School-Based Health Assembly will make the case for integration of comprehensive oral health care in the school-based health centers. This session will provide an overview of oral health services in SBHC's on the national and state levels, as well as prepare the audience to become oral health champions for their communities and SBHC's. She will be joined by **Courtney Kovach, PA-C, MBA Lincoln Primary Care.**

Dr. Richard Meckstroth, WVU School of Dentistry, professor and chairman of the Department of Dental Practice & Rural Health will provide the audience with an update an overview of the <u>Smiles Across America Sealant Initiative</u>. Information will be presented about the need for partnership, local support and discuss reporting requirements necessary to maintain funding.

Toma Young, RDH Kanawha Dental Health Council, will provide an update and highlight of the newly opened dental clinic located within Westside Elementary School. She will discuss funding, logistics barriers, and successes.

Closing Plenary Session –

Spit-Tobacco: The School-Aged Population, Effects on the Oral Cavity, and Identifying Low Cost Spit Tobacco Prevention Education and Cessation Methods.

Donald Reed and Cheryl Jackson, tobacco specialists with the Southern Coalfields Tobacco Prevention Network Office will identify low cost spit tobacco prevention education and cessation methods effective in rural, low socio-economic status populations. In addition the audience we learn about the effect of spit tobacco on the oral cavity.
