Veterans, their families and children likely will present to schools and community healthcare facilities before, during and after deployment. Both domestic and foreign deployments introduce complexities that can impact family dynamics and the welfare of the children involved.

Awareness and understanding is required to identify and address the diverse medical and behavioral healthcare needs of Veterans and families, including traumatic brain injury, post-traumatic stress disorder, depression and suicide risk, poverty, unemployment and homelessness. Special emphasis will be placed on working with the Veteran, their family, their children and the essential role that both VA and non-VA healthcare providers play.
